- Read the historical context and the task. Make sure you understand what the essay topic is about and what you need to do to write the essay.
- 2. Answer the scaffolding questions that go along with the documents.
 - 1. For each document read the questions that go along with them first.
 - 2. Make sure to look at the title, author, dates, etc., to identify the purpose or point of view of the document.
 - 3. Read the document and <u>underline any parts of the document</u> <u>that may be an answer to the question</u>.
 - 4. Answer the question by restating and using complete sentences.
